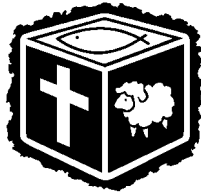

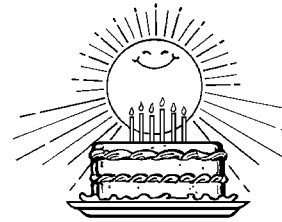

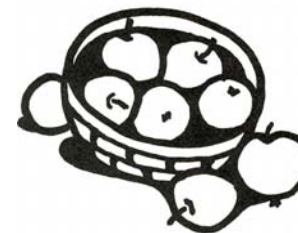

TABLE SCRAP SAFETY

Feeding your pet people food or table scraps should be avoided, however we all do it. So to do it safely we have listed some things to avoid totally when sneaking your furry friends treats from the table.



- Alcoholic beverages:** Can cause intoxication, coma and death.
- Baby food:** Can contain onion powder, which can be toxic to cats. It can also cause nutritional deficiencies if fed in large amounts.
- Bones from fish, poultry or others:** These can cause an obstruction or laceration in the digestive system.
- Chocolate, coffee, tea and other caffeine:** Contain caffeine, theobromine, or theophylline, which can be toxic and affect the nervous system.

5. **Dog Food for Cats:** If accidental ingestion, will not cause a problem; if fed repeatedly, may result in malnutrition and diseases affecting the heart.

6. **Cat Food for Dogs:** Generally too high in fat and proteins.

7. **Fat Trimmings:** Can cause pancreatitis.

8. **Grapes & raisins:** Contain an unknown toxin which can damage the kidneys.

9. **Human vitamins & supplements containing iron:** Can damage the lining of the digestive system and be toxic to other organs including the kidneys and liver.

10. **Large amount of liver:** Can cause a Vitamin A deficiency, which affects muscles and bones.

11. **Macadamia Nuts:** Contain an unknown toxin, that can affect the digestive and nervous systems and muscles.

12. **Milk and other dairy products:** Some adult cats and dogs do not have the sufficient amounts of the enzyme lactase, which breaks down the lactose in the milk. This can result in diarrhea. There are lactose free milk products available for pets.

13. **Moldy or spoiled food, garbage:** Can contain multiple toxins causing vomiting and diarrhea and can affect other organs.

14. **Mushrooms:** Can contain toxins, which can affect multiple systems in the body, cause shock, and result in death.

15. **Onions & Garlic (fresh, cooked, powder):** Contains sulfoxides and disulfides, which can damage red blood cells and cause anemia. Cats are more susceptible than dogs. Garlic is less toxic than onions.

16. **Sugary Foods:** Can lead to obesity, dental problems, and possibly diabetes mellitus.

**Abuse of Minors Pastoral Response Hotline
405-720-9878**

For the safety of children and the healing of victims, the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City provides an Abuse of Minors Pastoral Response Hotline for reporting the abuse of a minor (in the past or presently) by a member of the clergy or other church personnel.



Calls to this number will be answered by the Archdiocesan Assistance coordinator who will offer to meet with the caller in person, if the caller so desires. The Assistance Coordinator will also assist you in making a formal complaint to the Archdiocese, arranging a personal meeting with the Archbishop or his representative and in obtaining support and pastoral counseling.

Calls are confidential with the following exceptions:

- * Any allegation of sexual or physical abuse or neglect concerning those who currently are minors must be reported to the Oklahoma Dept. of Human Services 1-800-522-3511 as required by Oklahoma laws and Archdiocesan policies.
- * Any allegation of sexual misconduct must be shared with the proper Archdiocesan authorities.
- * Local law enforcement agencies may also be contacted.

In addition, there are several things you may do:

- * Contact the Oklahoma Dept. of Human Services 1-800-522-3511. Contacting DHS is mandatory if the victim is a minor.
- * Contact the appropriate law enforcement agency (for example the local police).
- * Contact local child protection agencies, a private attorney, &/or a support group.

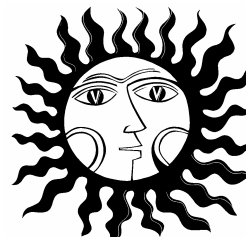
